Health & Safety Training

To access the training system go onto the internet and type in **Griffiths and Armour**. Then go to **Client Login** on the blue bar on top right hand side.

Your user ID is branchvolunteer@rspca.org.uk and the password is **training**.

Steps to follow

- You will be asked to register your details & create your own password in the Registration section. Your contact division is **Midlands and North** and site are **Leeds, Wakefield and District**.
- Your registration will be confirmed & it will prompt you to note down these details (or you can print them from this page). Please remember your user ID and password. Please note your User ID will not be your full name, e.g Paul Smith will be "psmith".

(If you do forget your password, there is a link on the log in page "**Forgotten password**", which will ask you to enter your email address, the system will send you an email with a new password).

- Click on "**Register**" at the bottom of the page. Then choose "**Login**" again & enter your new username and password.
- Please read the terms and conditions and click "**I accept**" at bottom of the page.
- From the Training system drop down menu choose - "system instructions" - please read the trainee instructions before you start. (To exit the instructions click the X at the top of the tab).

Under the Training system option you will find "**Training modules**". There are a number of modules, **we only require you to complete the following modules in this order**:

1. General Health and safety
 2. Fire
 3. Manual handling (These modules are the minimum requirement, but you may do more if you wish).
- Please choose "**Begin tutorial**" to start each module and follow the steps. Please work through the tutorial first, you will then be asked to confirm you have read and understood the information at the end of each module and finally proceed to a short test, to start the test choose "**Please click here**".
 - Once you have completed the test your pass mark will be displayed, plus the answers to any questions you answered incorrectly. The test has a pass mark of 70%. (If you fail you can re-read the tutorial and re-take the test).
 - Please confirm you have read and understood the training provided, **click on "Confirm" at the bottom of the page**.
 - Click "**Return to modules**" to work through the next module, or "**Log out**" if you have completed all three modules.
